

# Chinatown

Chinatown is a principal Chinese town in Chicago. There are 70 000 inhabitants in this town. Now, Chicago chinatown is the third of the country, after New York and San Francisco.

The first Chinese immigrants arrived in Chicago in the late 1870s : there were former railroad workers who fled the discrimination of the american west. With the communist Revolution in China, the population of chinatown increases very much in the late 1950s – 1960s .
